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

Welcome to all our young stars! Digboi Mahila Mahavidyalaya is one of the premier Women's Colleges in the North-Eastern part of Assam situated in the Digboi oil town. The College has the reputation of outstanding performance in Academic, Sports, Co-curricular activities etc. Digboi Mahila Mahavidyalaya was established in 1981, at the dawn of the 9th decade of Twentieth Century. The College deserves its place of pride among the colleges of the Eastern most parts of Assam. Digboi, the oldest oil town of the country has a glorious background in the history of education in the state as well in the North- Eastern part of India.

Within a very short period since the inception of the college. Digboi Mahila Mahavidyalaya now stands as an excellent institution of higher learning promoting education of women in the region. The Institution has also extended its leadership in the field of higher education for Students from neighboring Arunachal Praclesh. Nagaland and various parts of Assam. Apart from the academic affairs, the college maintains a good standing in matters pertaining to other spheres of life viz.- cultural activities, sports, social harmonization among diverse tribes, caste and creed etc. It is worth mentioning that since its inception, the LO.C. (A.O.D.) Ltd., Digboi has played a vital role in the growth of the Institution.


#### LOCATION:

Digboi Mahila Mahavidyalaya is located in Muliabari, a place which is considered to be equidistant from the Commercial bub. Chariali on the one hand, and Bapapung, the diametrically opposite end of the town on the other. The arterial road connecting Digboi town and Bordamsa in Annuchal Pradesh runs by the college and therefore, this is one more advantage for the college to have been capable of attracting students from both Digboi town and its peripheral areas, as well as far-fluog remote places of the border state, Arunschal Pradesh. Distance from the Chariali (NH. 37 runs through it) is approximately 3 kms. Latitude ~ 27.40071 and Longitude ~ 95.63435 for the college campus.

#### HOSTEL:

The college provides hostel accommodation to the deserving students. The College hostel has an intuke capacity of 260 (New Hostel: 120 & Old Hostel: 140) Students. The hostel maintains a strict set of disciplinary rules. The rooms are well maintained and the food served is hygienic. The application for admission and conduct in the hostel are governed by

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the cotlege hostel rules. The hostels remain closed during the Semester Breaks decided as per the academic calendar of Dibrugarh University. Students are allowed to stay in the hostel for one session only. All boarders are to maintain strict discipline as per hostel rules. Violation of the rules results in strict action, even to the extent of expulsion from the hostel as well as the college.

The hostel is located conveniently at a 2 minute walking distance from the college. It has high concrete boundary walls on all the four sides that ensures safety and security of the students at all the times. There is a Gate-Keeper, who maintains a register of all the visitors to the hostel during the day-time. At night, there are Night Chowkiders to keep visit.

#### HOSTEL ADMISSION:

The College offers some seats in the hostel to outstation new entrants. There is a separate form available for hostel admission. This should be filled and submitted to the college office along with the application.

Students should report personally to the Warden after they have completed the college admission formulities and register their name with the Warden. Please note that this in itself does not ensure admission which will be done strictly on the basis of marks and the number of seats available. College admission does not automatically ensure hostel accommodation.

#### LIBRARY:

A. The College has a newly constructed library with a decent collection of books for all. Subjects. Besides, it also subscribes a number of books for all subjects. Moreover, it also subscribes a number of News papers. News magazines. Bulletins, Journals, Text books, Reference materials, etc. It has a specious reading Hall for students, which remains occupied most of the time by students browsing through books or jotting down notes. There is a provision to encurage students by giving prize for much users of the library. The Present stock of books is approximately 25000 including some rare publications. The library also has been computerized and has INTERNET FACILITIES where the students can browse through for their intellectual and academic gains. The students can borrow books and journals through open access system.

#### STUDENTS MUST ABIDE BY THE RULES SET BY THE LIBRARY:

- The working hours of the library is 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on all working days.
- Strict Silence and decorum should be maintained in the library all the time. The students are not allowed to bring their bags to the library.
- (iii) Library books issued can be retained for one week only. A fine will have to be paid by the students retaining books for more than a week.
- (iv) Identity cards and library cards must be produced at the time of borrowing and returning the books.
- If library books are found torn, damaged or lost, the cost of the book(s) has to be paid by the students responsible for it.
- (vi) A maximum number of two books are issued at a time to the students but for the poor students more then two books may be issued.
- vii) The borrower shall not sub-lend the books issued from the library.
- (viii) Library clearances from the librarian are necessary for the students before collecting admit cards for any University/ Council Examinations.

B. Along with the Central library almost all Departments have their separate library.

#### COMPUTER LAB:

The Computer lab is well equipped with all modern hardware and software facilities along with all time Internet connectivity. It offers both basic and professional computer training in the latest Information Technology sector.

#### CANTEEN:

There is a healthy and hygienic canteen inside the college premises. Drinking water and soft drinks facilities are available in the college. It is run under the guidance of the Canteen Committee. The Canteen is spacious enough for

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pupils to move about and take their seats. The food articles provided are of very cheap rates and full of nourishment. The Canteen services are properly supervised by the Canteen Committee from time to time.

#### STUDENT'S COMMON ROOM:

The college has well structured common room facility for the students. The room if well furnished and ventilated and having some other facilities like vending machine etc. Students can spend their off classes by utilizing the facilities in the common room.

#### STUDENT AID FUND/ SCHOLARSHIPS:

The meritorious and economically weak students can take help from the 'Student Aid Fund' as per rules framed by the committee. The institution also assists the students to get scholarships through National Scholarship Portal under UGC.

#### OTHER FACILITIES IN THE COLLEGE CAMPUS:

- (a) Drinking water facilities: Aquaguard, RO are available for drinking water purpose.
- (b) Electricity Facilities: Electricity available with 24 x 7 power backup (inverter, Generator) system.
- (c) Internet facilities available in the campus.

#### MEDICAL FACILITIES:

There is a Health Care Centre in the college with sufficient facilities. The College provides medical facilities and health education programme for the benefit of the Students. For specially abled students provision of ramp and wheel chair are also available in the college. The College invites a Medical Officer or a Registered Medical Practitioner from time to time to examine the students health. A First-Aid- Box is kept in the college for accidental injuries of the Students. Officers of the Health Department and Medical Officers deliver special lectures and demonstrations on health and hygiene from time to time. The college also organizes Yoga and Meditation programmes by experts for the all round development of the Students.

#### FIELD STUDY AND EDUCATIONAL TOUR:

The College organizes different field study programmes with the students of the respective departments and educational tours. A committee of Students is formed to organize the trip under the guidance of a lecturer. In course of the educational tour the Students are bound to abide by the rules and regulations. It is compulsory for the students of the respective departments to take part in such tours.

#### STUDENT LIFE:

Student life at Digboi Mahila Mahavidyalaya can be a very rewarding experience. 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#### DIBRUGARH UNIVERSITY REGULATIONS FOR THE FOUR YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES (FYUGP) IN CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS), 2023

#### (1) Short Title, Commencement and Applicability

These Regulations shall be called the Dibrugarh University Regulations for the Four Year Undergraduate Programmes (FYUGP) in Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), 2023. These Regulations shall be effective for the Courses of Study leading to a UG Certificate. UG Diploma. Three Year UG Degree, Four Year UG Degree (Honours) and Four Year UG Degree (Honours with Research). Hereinafter, it will be referred to as Dibrugarh University Regulations for the Four Year Undergraduate Programme in Choice Based Credit System, 2023.

The Regulations shall come in to effect from the Academic Session, 2023-2024.

The Regulations shall be applicable to the students enrolled in the aforementioned academic programmes conducted by the Departments/Centers for Studies of Dibrugarh University/Colleges/Institutes affiliated to/permitted by Dibrugarh University from the academic session 2023-24.

#### 2. Objectives

#### The objectives of the regulations are-

To conduct undergraduate programmes— UG Certificate, UG Diploma, Three Year UG Degree, Four Year UG Degree (Honours) and Four Year UG Degree (Honours with Research) in various fields of Study/Discipline as per the guidelines of UGC's Curriculum and Credit Framework in the light of NEP, 2020.

To provide a multidisciplinary set-up to build vibrant communities of scholars and peers, breakdown harmful silos, enable students to become well rounded across disciplines including artistic, creative, and analytical subjects as well as sports, develop active research communities across disciplines, increase resource efficiency across higher education.

To nurture avenues for developing holistic individuals through an identified set of skills and values.

To provide a student centric, flexible, choice based credit framework with multiple entry and exit options so that students can be facilitated to pursue the trail of career chosen by themselves as per their interest. Prospectus 2024-25



#### COLLEGE EXAMINATION [ For both H.S. & B.A (CBCS), T.D.C. Courses]:

- Alongwith University and Council Examinations, there will be Unit Test in the college conducted by the respective departments according to the academic calender of the college, as part of its internal continuous evaluation.
- A student must appear in all the unit tests. If a student fails to appear in the Unit Test, she will not be allowed to appear in the Selection Test Examination.
- iii) The Progress Report of the Unit Tests are sent to the Guardians / Parents of respective student (s) and the student (s) are directed to return the said Progress Report to the office of the college after getting duty signed by the Guardian (s) Parents (s).
- iv) The students will be allowed to appear in the Selection Test on the basis of all the unit tests marks. The decision of the Selection Committee will be final.
- v) The student (s) who fails in the selection test will not be considered to appear in the Final Examination.

#### NOTE:

- 1) Student offering Major Course in various disciplines are required to sit for an Entrance Test generally conducted by the department concerned. This is a measure adopted aiming to maintain the quality of Higher Education. A student willing to take up Major in any subject must secure 2nd division (Regular Pass) H.S. final examination with minimum 50% marks in the concerned subject in order to appear in the Selection Test for Major subject.
- 2) The final examinations are conducted as per regulations of AHSEC and Dibruagrh University.

#### COLLEGE DISCIPLINE

- If the student is found guilty of misconduct / indiscipline as per the regulation of the University, she on the advice
  of the Principal to the Vice-Chancellor, may be expelled / rusticated for a stated period / debarred from the
  University for a stated period / fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified, debarred from taking the
  University examination for one or more years / have the result of the examination, in which she may have
  appeared, cancelled.
- Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under the University ordinance.
- The Principal and the Hostel Warden should be immediately informed of the cases of ragging. Abetment to ragging will also amount to ragging.
- Punishment for ragging includes rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years / cancellation of the result of the examination in which she / they may have appeared.
- It may be noted that the college takes a serious view of any individual / group which includes in verbal threats, taunts and harassment and physical intimidation, assault etc. Strong disciplinary action will be taken against anyone found to be doing so, and may include expulsion from the college.
- 6. Use of Mobile Phones in the college campus strictly prohibited. Violation of rules attracts a fine of Rs. 1000/-.





- (d) Candidates are required to produce at the time of admission, the original copies of:
- i) Mark sheet of the last qualifying Examination
- ii) Age / Pass Certificate
- iii) Caste Certificate
- iv) Character Certificate
- v) Migration Certificate in case the student is from other than SEBA, AHSEC & Dibrugarh University,
- vi) Authentic Annual Income Certificate.
- (e) Students possing the qualifying examination earlier than the current year will have to submit a gap certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended / migration / gazetted Officer.
- (f) Admission to the Hostel can be taken on the same day of admission to the college as per regulations of the Hostel rules. To get admission into the Hostel requires prior approval of the Principal. A candidate who fails to deposit fee for hostel admission will result in forfeiture of her seat.
- (g) H.S. 1st year student who fails to get promoted to the next higher class may be admitted after submission of fresh admission form as per AHSEC admission rules.

#### FIRST CLASS:

If she secures 60% or above marks in Honours subject and passes in all other subjects.

#### SECOND CLASS:

If she secures 45% or above but less than 60% marks in the Honours subject and passes in all other subjects.

#### ATTENDANCE IN CLASSES:

Ideally the student should attend all lectures and practicals held during the year in all the subjects (or papers). In case the student is unable to do so, then she must have 80% attendance for both H.S. & B.A. Courses.

Any Student failing to attend the specified percentage of classes shall not be permitted to appear in both the internal examinations conducted by the college as well as the Final Examination conducted by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council and Dibrugarh University, Failure to secure this minimum percentage will make the student ineligible to sit for the annual examinations.

- If absent due to serious disabling illness or any other major causes the student should submit an application supported by an authentic documents within a week of her return to college. The certificate should be signed by the subject teachers.
- If the student missed classes because of sports she has to get a certificate from the sports teacher. According to University rules, the total period of absence in case of State / National level sports events should not exceed 30 days respectively, including the journey period, in an academic year.
- iii) If the student missed classes because she is participating in the college (inter-college) events, she should get a certificate from the Union Advisor concerned. No exemption from attendance will the allowed for rehersals.
  In no case will the concessions granted under i, ii, iii or in any combination, thereof should exceed 1/3 rd of the total number of lectures.





#### 4. Definitions:

Undergraduate Programmes: Undergraduate programmes will include the following

- (i) UG Certificate programme: UG Certificate Programme leads to a UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG certificate (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 44 Credits on completion of Semester II if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester examination. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.
- (ii) UG Diploma Programme: UG Diploma Programme leads to a UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG Diploma (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 88 Credits on completion of Semester IV if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based





vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 4<sup>th</sup> semester examination. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the maximum period of seven years.

- (iii) Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelors in other disciplines) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year (6 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing a minimum of 132 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.
- (iv) Four Year UG Programme with honours (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelors in other disciplines) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years, securing a minimum of 176 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.
- (v) Four Year UG Programme with honours with Research (BA, B, Sc, B, Com and Bachelors in other disciplines) with single/double major; Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours and research degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years with a rigorous research project, securing a minimum of 176 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.

College: The term 'College' means the Colleges and Institutes affiliated to or permitted by Dibrugarh University for conducting different academic programmes.

Department: The term 'Department' is used to mean a Department of Dibrugarh University/a College/Institute affiliated to/ permitted by Dibrugarh University.

Centre for Studies: The term 'Centre for Studies' is used to mean a Centre for Studies of Dibrugarh University/a College/Institute affiliated to/ permitted by Dibrugarh University

Programme: The term 'programme' is used to mean the whole learning experience or combination of courses pursued for a Certificate, Diploma or a Degree.

Course: A "Course" means one of the specified units which goes to comprise a programme of study.

Academic Year: An 'Academic Year' means a period of twelve months consisting of two semesters.

#### CHANGE OF SUBJECT:

Any student intending to change subject must apply for such change within 10 (Ten) days, from the date of admission and must be settled within 15 (Fifteen) days for both H.S. and BA. first semester. No further date shall be extended. Acceptance of change wholely depended upon the department concern.

#### TEACHING PLAN:

Based on the Academic Calendar, Teaching Plans for all the classes of H.S. and T.D.C. are prepared by the Academic Committee of the College at the beginning of every Academic Session. The teaching plans include remedial classes for the weak students and special care is taken of the brilliant students. The emphasis is given on timely completion of courses and other activities so as to enable the students to prepare for examinations in right earnest. The overall progress of the student(s) is individually monitored throughout.

#### RESERVATION:

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Semester: The word "semester" is used to mean a half-yearly term or term of studies including examinations, vacations and semester breaks.

Semester Duration: A semester normally extends over a period of 15 class weeks. Each week has 30 hours of instruction spread over the week,

In semester: The word "in-semester" is used to refer to the continuous evaluation within the half-yearly term.

End-semester: The word "end-semester" is used to refer to the terminal processes of examinations and evaluations at the end but within the half-yearly term.

Credit: A 'credit' is a unit by which the coursework is measured. It determines the number of hours of instruction required per week over the duration of a semester (minimum 15 weeks). A course may have only a lecture component or a lecture and tutorial component or a lecture and practicum component or a lecture, tutorial and practicum component, or only practicum component. Credit shall be defined as

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC): 'Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)' is an academic service mechanism as a digital/virtual/online entity established and managed by MOE/UGC to facilitate students to become its academic account holders and paving the way of seamless student mobility, between or within degree-granting Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) through a formal system of credit recognition, credit accumulation, credit transfers and credit redemption to promote distributed and flexible teaching learning.

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Credit accumulation: 'Credit Accumulation' means the facility created by ABC in the Academic Bank Account opened by the students across the country in order to transfer and consolidate the 'credits' earned by them by undergoing 'courses' in any of the eligible HEIs.

Credit recognition: 'Credit Recognition' means the credits earned through eligible/partnering HEIs and transferred directly to the ABC by the concerned HEIs.

Credit redemption: 'Credit redemption' means the process of commuting the accrued 'credits' in the Academic Bank Account of the students maintained in ABC for the purpose of fulfilling the 'credits requirements' for the award of Certificates/Diplomas/Degrees etc. by the degree awarding HEIs.







#### 9 Course Enrolment

The minimum and maximum credits to be opted by a student for qualifying of a Undergraduate programme shall be as per the Course Structure given as Annexure I.

Change in Major: Students shall be allowed to change major within the broad discipline at the end of the second semester by giving him/her sufficient time to explore interdisciplinary courses during the first year. The HEIs may create 10% additional seats over and above the sanctioned strength to accommodate the request for a change of major.

Change in Minor: Students shall be allowed to change Minor courses of his/her areas of interest within the broad discipline at the end of the third semester. If a student pursuing a major obtains a minimum of 12 credits from another branch then the student will be awarded Bachelor degree in previous with a minor in later.

#### 10 Attendance

The Course Teacher shall be responsible for maintaining a record of attendance of students who have enrolled for the course.

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calendar days before the last instruction day in the semester, the particulars of all students who have less than 80% of attendance during the total number of class days.

A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination. However, that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons, on recommendation of the Head/Chairperson/ Principals of the Department/Centre/College on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

The Head of the Departments/Chairperson of the Centre for Studies/Principals of the Colleges shall announce the names of all students who shall not be eligible to take the Endsemester examinations in the various Programmes and send a copy of the same to the Controller of Examinations. Such candidates shall have to repeat the concerned Course(s) when it is offered next.

A student declared as dis-collegiate shall not be allowed to proceed to the next higher Semester. He/she shall need to pursue the Semester afresh in which he/she was declared as dis-collegiate along with the next fresh batch.


#### 11 Examination and Evaluation:

- (a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least two times during a Semester including the End Semester Examination.
- (b) There shall be 20% marks for in-semester assessment and 80% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.
- (c) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.

#### (d) In-semester Assessment:

- In in-semester assessment, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses may be employed.
- (ii) The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall be required to compulsorily attend in-semester assessment including appearing the sessional tests, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semester examination. A Student cannot repeat In-semester examinations. The Department/Centre for Studies may arrange special in-semester examination whenever

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necessary.

#### (e) End Semester Examination:

- (i) There shall be one End semester examination carrying 80% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the Course. The End semester examination is normally a written/laboratory-based examination/Project Work/Dissertation.
- (ii) The Controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the End semester examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the University.
- (iii) The time given for End-semester examination for each Course shall be based on the credits/marks of the course.
- (iv) Emphasis needs to be given on problem solving, application level questions as prescribed by National Education Policy, 2020. The question paper should include different forms of question.
- (f) Confidential Works: Setting of question papers, moderation of question papers, evaluation of answer scripts, scrutiny, tabulation of marks, etc. and announcement of results, shall be governed by the Dibrugarh University Examination Ordinance.
- (g) The mode of the conduct of the end-semester examinations of the practical/dissertation courses shall be partially external as below;
  - The end-semester examinations of all practical/dissertation courses shall be conducted by a Board of Examiners consisting of the internal examiner (the concerned course teacher) and an external examiner appointed by the Controller of Examinations.
  - A student shall not be allowed to take more than one full course as project work in a single semester.
- (h) The mode of end-semester examination and evaluation of the Course shall be specified in the detailed syllabus of the course concerned.
- End-semester practical examinations shall normally be held before the theory examinations.

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#### (j) Betterment Examination:

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- i. A student shall be entitled to take the 'Betterment Examinations' in any two theory courses after successful completion of 3 year/4year programme only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the Sixth/Eight Semester examination. Students shall have to appear in the betterment examination with the regular batch.
- ii. No betterments shall be allowed in the practical/project/dissertation/internship examinations.

#### 12 Results and Progression:

A candidate shall be declared as passed a Programme, provided he/she secures-

At least 30% of marks in each Course in the End Semester Examinations combining both theory and practical examinations

At least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale combining both the in-semester and EndSemester Examination performance.

There shall be no separate pass mark for In-semester Assessment.

A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester/ programme, provided he/ she secures at least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale (given in clause) in all the Courses separately.

There may be moderation of In-semester Assessment marks/End Semester marks as and when necessary.

The marks of In-semester examinations obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring any result.

A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more Courses of any end semester examinations up to fifth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carryover course in the next regular examinations of those courses. If a candidate fails in any of the components (either theory or practical) of a course the candidate shall have to reappear in the examination for both the components,

If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of the sixth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of

the previous semesters.

A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of seventh semester examinations shall be provisionally promoted to the eighth semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). If a candidate clears the eight semester examination before clearing all the courses of the seventh semesters, the result of the eighth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semester.

A student must clear all his/her Semester Examinations within six (6) years for three year undergraduate programme and seven years for four year undergraduate programme (with honours/research) from the dates of admission to the First Semester of any Programme irrespective of the number of examinations appeared by the student.

Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.

A candidate shall be declared to have passed provided he/she has passed all the Semesters and in all the Courses separately for the concerned programme.

The Controller of Examinations shall declare the results of different programmes and issue Grade-sheets. The merit list shall be prepared only for the regular candidates and it does not include the backlog candidates.

The first rank holder of a programme shall be decided on the basis of the CGPA. However, the Overall Weighted Percentage of Marks (OWPM) of a candidate shall be considered in case of tie in CGPA.

Results of the candidates appeared in the Betterment or Backlog Examinations shall not be counted for the award of Prizes/Medals, Rank or Distinction.

#### 13 Provision of Multiple Exit:

Exit 1: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 1 year (two semesters). A Certificate will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year 1 (2 semesters). Students who have secured minimum of 44 credits will be awarded a UG certificate (in the field of study/discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester examination.

Exit 2: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 2 years (four semesters. A Diploma will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year 2 (4 semesters). Students who have secured minimum of 88 credits will be awarded a UG Prospectus 2024-25

The students on exit shall be awarded Bachelor of (in the Field of Study/Discipline) (3 years) after securing the requisite 132 Credits on completion of Semester VI

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Diploma (in the field of study/discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 4th Semester examination.

Exit 3: Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 3 years (six semesters). Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme shall be awarded UG degree in the major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 132 credits.

Four Year UG Programme with Honours (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the major discipline after successful completion of four years with Discipline Specific Elective Courses in 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> semesters in lieu of Research Project and Dissertation, securing a minimum of 176 credits.

Four Year UG Programme with Honours with Research (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours with Research degree in the major discipline after successful completion of four years, with Research Project and Dissertation in 7th and 8th Semesters, securing 176 credits.

#### 20 General:

- a. It shall be ensured that the University shall maintain fundamental code of professional ethics in implementing these Regulations.

The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

- (iii) Conversion of CGPA in to percentage (%): CGPA will be multiplied by 10. Percentage of marks = (CGPA X 10)
- (iv) The Letter grade 'B\*' and above shall be considered as First Class and Letter grade 'B' shall be considered as Second Class.
- (v) A student is considered to have completed a course successfully and earned the prescribed credits if he/she secures a letter grade other than F (Failed) or 'Abs' (Absent/Incomplete).
- (vi) If a candidate secures 'F' grade in a Course, he/she shall have to reappear in the

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Course in the next legitimate chance.

- (vii) If a student secures 'F' grade in Project Work/ Dissertation/ assignment etc., he/she shall have to re-submit it after necessary revisions. The Result shall be declared with next regular batch.
  - (a) 'Abs' grade shall be awarded to a candidate if he/she has not fulfilled the following requirements;
  - (b) If a candidate fails to appear in any Course(s) in an end semester examination.
  - (c) If a candidate fails to submit the project work/dissertation / assignment of an end semester examination.
  - (d) If a candidate is certified as not eligible to appear in any course(s) in an end semester examination by the Course Teacher(s) due to insufficient attendance in lectures, tutorials practical or fieldworks.
- (viii) The candidates not appearing in a Semester Examination shall be considered as an 'Abs' candidate and that will be reflected in the Grade Sheet of the candidate. These candidates shall have to convert the 'Abs' grade by appearing in the next examination on the Course (provided he/ she has legitimate chance to appear the Course) concerned or by submitting project work/dissertation/ assignment etc.

#### 16 Transcript

The University may issue consolidated Transcript on payment of a prescribed fee which shall contain Letter grades, grade points and SGPA and CGPA mentioning the Course Titles in details, medium of instruction and programme duration.

#### Institution Registration:

#### 17.1.1.1

The HEIs shall register on NAD/ABC in the concerned portal, Institution shall designate a Nodal Officer and set up a dedicated NAD/ABC cell for implementation of NAD/ABC Scheme and reflect their details (Name, Designation, Mobile No. and email id) on its website.

#### 17.1.1.2

Institution shall advise the students to register on ABC through the ABC portal

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#### 17.1.1.3

Institution shall make ABC id a mandatory field in the admission forms. Examination forms or if possible on students Identity card also.

#### 17.1.1.4

Institution shall display the posters and templates and place them on the canteen, Library, Notice Board and around the playground or the place where there is maximum movements of students

#### 17.1.1.5

Institution shall organize Seminar/Workshop for information and publicity about

ABC in campus as well as respective affiliated colleges.

Student Registration: Students shall register themselves by visiting the ABC website and creating a student account through the concerned institution and records has to be submitted to the institution.

18 Credit Transfer: Inter- Institutional transfer of Credits may be considered by the Dibrugarh University on reciprocal basis or in compliance with the relevant Guidelines of the UGC. However, a candidate from other university has to fulfill minimum credit requirements as prescribed by Dibrugarh University.

#### 19 Mentor Mentee Forum

There shall be Mentor Mentee forums in each semester in each of the Department and Centre for Studies. The forum will be comprised of the Mentor to be appointed by the Head of the department/Chairperson of the Centre for Studies and assigned mentees. Concerned mentor shall act as Chairperson and a nominated/selected mentee as Coordinator.

#### Functions of Mentor Mentee forum will be-

Dealing with the issues experienced by the mentees in the classroom, laboratories, internship, field work, project work etc or in any other academic activities.

Orienting the mentees the details of the FYUGP regulation. Orienting the mentees with the academic schedule including the dates of assessment and the syllabus coverage for each assessment. Analyzing the performance of the mentees after each of the tests and findingthe ways to improve. Conducting at least one meeting in a month

#### Functions of Mentor Mentee forum will be-

To act as a link between the Head of the Department/Chairperson of the Centrefor Studies and the concerned mentees. To collect and maintain various records as required by the Department/Chairperson of the Centre for Studies. Guiding the mentees in various academic functions.
